






### 1. East Park

- ⇒ East Park has the highest concentration of trees, shrubs, rose beds, herbaceous plants, spring and summer bulbs, bedding, ferns, grasses and bamboos of the Central Parks
- ⇒ With a rockery, ponds, a commemorative circular mosaic, wisteria pergola (flowers in May), the Titanic engineers memorial, the Queens Peace fountain and plenty places to sit
- ⇒ There is a café in the pavilion, The Flying Aubergine, offering a range of delicious hot and cold dishes, including some gluten free options. You can download a copy of the menu (see website). Free WiFi is available in the cafe and patio area
- ⇒ Equipment for use on the miniature golf course is available to hire from the pavilion

### 2. Farley Mount Country Park

- ⇒ A large area of beautiful downland and woodland, including West Wood
- ⇒ The Park is ideal for walking and picnicking, with fine views over central Hampshire, particularly from the monument at Beacon Hill
- ⇒ There are cycle trails and guided walks, as well as regular events (see website)
- ⇒ Calling in advance is advised for large groups or if you are travelling any distance to ensure areas are not closed for events



### 3. Hamble Common

- ⇒ 55 acres of coastal heath at the end of the Hamble Peninsula
- ⇒ The area has a wide range of habitats including coastal heath, woodland, saltmarsh and mudflats, and is a popular site for bird watching
- ⇒ It also has some interesting history, with the remains of WWII weaponry, a Tudor castle and Iron-age settlements
- ⇒ Activities run throughout the year (see website for calendar of events)

### 4. Holly Hill Woodland Park

- ⇒ A historical area of parkland which has been awarded a Green Flag for sustainable biodiversity
- ⇒ Over 70 acres of woodland and 5 acres of lakes
- ⇒ Situated on the banks of the River Hamble, there are picturesque views across the valley. There are Victorian landscaped gardens with lakes, islands, waterfalls, many exotic plants and natural woodland which is rich with wildlife
- ⇒ A lovely area for walks and picnics, with plenty of picnic tables and benches

## 5. Itchen Valley Country Park

- ⇒ 440 acres of beautiful water meadows, woodland and meadows
- ⇒ Visitor Centre with nature-based displays, two play areas, a shop, toilets and café
- ⇒ Several marked trails around the Park.
- ⇒ The Play Trail and new Totem Trail for children, with play equipment to climb on along the way. Two play areas; a small one for the younger children near the Visitor Centre and a larger adventure play area on High Hill Field.
- ⇒ Throughout the year there are activities including campfire cooking, den-building, pond dipping and natural crafts (see website for calendar of events)
- ⇒ Picnics are encouraged and there are many tables throughout the Park.

### 6. Lakeside Country Park

- ⇒ Restored gravel works, with wildlife including birds, insects, small mammals and the occasional fox and deer
- ⇒ A popular fishing site, with designated trails and picnic sites
- ⇒ There's a café which sells hot and cold food and drinks, and Eastleigh Lakeside Railway

## 7. Lepe Country Park

- ⇒ Coastal Country Park in the New Forest with views across the Solent to the Isle of Wight
- ⇒ Over a mile of beach, pine fringed cliffs, historic D-Day remains and meadows
- ⇒ The park is popular for walking, swimming, fishing, windsurfing and bird or boat watching.
- ⇒ Play area, picnic & barbecue areas, Lepe Beach Café and gift shop
- ⇒ Wildlife activities and events for children (see website for current details)
- ⇒ Family Fun Events: nature detectives, craft events, guided walks





## 8. Moors Valley Country Park

- ⇒ Many play areas, walking trails, cycle routes, visitor centre, nature trails, feed the ducks
- ⇒ Moors Valley Steam Railway, the South's longest fully signalled narrow gauge railway (adult return £3.55, child return £2.35)
- ⇒ Seasons Restaurant serving a wide range of food, ice cream kiosk, picnics & BBQs are welcomed
- ⇒ Check website for visitor centre and steam train operating times as they slightly vary









- ⇒ Tarmac walkways and accessible fishing platforms
- ⇒ Free parking fro tax exempt disabled
- ⇒ Disabled and 1 'changing places' standard toilet

## 9. Royal Victoria Country Park

- ⇒ Playgrounds suitable for all levels of ability and are wheelchair accessible
- ⇒ Sensory Garden with smooth paths, raised flower beds, a fountain, woodland, duck pond and tree trail
- ⇒ Cedar Tea Rooms and BBQ area
- ⇒ Trails and woodland walks with accessible paths, seashore activities, concerts and events (see website)
- ⇒ Shingle/sand beach with passing boats and ships (good for playing on)
- → Netley Chapel: the last remaining part of the Royal Victoria Military Hospital, contains historical exhibitions and a heritage centre.
- ⇒ Royal Victoria Railway: miniature steam and diesel trains run along a 1 mile scenic route. Various events (see website)









- ⇒ Parking is free to blue badge holders
- ⇒ Central area is wheelchair accessible (ramp to beach),
- ⇒ Limited accessibility in far corners of the park

### 10. Sir Harold Hillier Gardens

- ⇒ The 180 acre gardens with over 42,000 plants are a lovely place to visit in all seasons
- ⇒ World famous Gardens, Azalea Woodlands, The Pond, Hydrangea Walk, Himalayan Valley, the 250m Centenary Border and much more
- ⇒ Children will enjoy the Tree House, Bamboo Tunnel, Flying Carpet swing, visiting the pigs and exploring the Education Garden.
- ⇒ Self-guided activity trails, exhibitions and events such as the popular Art in the Garden sculpture exhibition running throughout the summer
- ⇒ Children's activities are held throughout the year such as Bushcraft, Pond Dipping, Tree Climbing as well as Craft Activities
- ⇒ Restaurant and summer tea rooms

- ⇒ The Community Award winning Southampton Common is a much loved and well used green space and is also a Site of Special Scientific Interest.
- ⇒ Lakes and wildlife
- ⇒ Lots of space for football, games, cycling picnics and BBQ's
- ⇒ A playground for children, near The Cowherds pub
- ⇒ Also the home of a historical site, Southampton's Old Cemetery
- ⇒ Hawthorn Urban Wildlife Centre is situated on the south east corner of Southampton Common and provides information about Southampton's abundant wildlife (see 'animals' for more info on this)
- ⇒ There is a Paddling Pool on the common on occasion in the summer months -for more information about the paddling pool, please contact The Quays Swimming and Diving Complex on 023 8072 0900

- ⇒ Study centre fully accessible when open



### 13. Testwood Lake Nature Reserve

- ⇒ A 150 acre site with lots of wildlife, grassland, woodland, lakes and walks
- ⇒ There is a study centre, 2 bird hides half a mile from the centre and events run throughout the year
- ⇒ They can provide expectation sheets and tactile Makaton wildlife sheets







- ⇒ Parking 8am-6pm Summer, 8am-4pm Winter
- ⇒ Gates are accessible by RADAR key
- ⇒ 1 RADAR key available to borrow
- ⇒ All-terrain wheelchair available to borrow (suggested £5 donation) Mon-Fri 9am-5pm, Sat-Sun 1pm-4pm, call ahead as the centre is not always staffed

- ⇒ Situated in the beautiful surroundings of the New Forest, close to the Beaulieu river and 10 minutes drive from the beach
